


# How bad is it out there?







### What's stressful about networking?

- \* I don't know anyone important
- \* Networking feels really awkward



#### Getting started: your network is bigger than you realize













What types of people are you trying to meet?

First: connectors and big-picture specialists. You'll enjoy them and they'll like you. They'll get you started.

Second: People at **the specific organizations** where you'd like to work.
They can help open doors

Third: **Extra recommendations** from people already in your network. "Who else should I be talking to?"

**After college,** Kevin Greer was a non-lvy grad seeking a State Department job




When hiring managers wouldn't reply, he chatted up the administrative staff

### Where might you want the conversation to go?

- Simplest case: I'd like to learn about career opportunities in your field. Can we chat a little?
- A variant: tell me your story of "How I got here."
- When they're ready: What ways I could join your organization?
- Could I shadow you for an afternoon on the job?
- Could you critique my work?
- Most ingenious ask: Could you come talk to our campus or alumni group?




# How to get paid properly

- Start with portfolio-building project work. (Say yes a lot)

- 5. Find, praise and build your team




