Which reflects the breakdown of jobs by level of government?


NUMBER OF GOVERNMENT JOBS BY LEVEL, IN **MILLIONS**









The percentage of young people, ages 18-29, who said they had performed each action, and the percentage who said they have not but may do so in the future.






Expectations of government are shifting

% saying government ...



Research	Policy aide (for councilmember, legislator); evaluation officer
Talking/writing	Public information officer

- There are more than 109,000 cities








Explore your area, and don't forget...

- Cities, states, and <u>counties</u>
- Non-executive agency roles: city councils, legislatures,
 Secretary of State/election administrators, treasurers, DA/AG,
 Court systems, school districts
- "Independent" authorities/publicly held corporations: Transit authorities, public utilities, housing authorities, public health boards/authorities
- Cross gov't orgs: metropolitan planning organizations, league of cities/counties

Your universities are resources

Your universities are your partners in equipping you with skills and connections to make the public service leap.

Do I need a special resume?

No.*

Well...

- Governments vary. Review carefully!
- In a cover letter or header statement, explicitly invoke key skills listed in the job description
- S/L job applications may not use resume-based hiring



I have loans! Can I afford it?

PSLF: Public Service Loan Forgiveness

PSLF will forgive undergraduate and graduate loans from qualifying loan types (federal direct) if you make 120 qualifying payments (IBR plans) while working at qualifying employers (governments, 501c3 nonprofits).
